1	CORONER
	I am Andrew Cox, Acting Senior Coroner, for the coroner area of Cornwall & Isles of Scilly.
2	CORONER'S LEGAL POWERS
	I make this report under paragraph 7, Schedule 5, of the Coroners and Justice Act 2009 and regulations 28 and 29 of the Coroners (Investigations) Regulations 2013.
3	INVESTIGATION
	On 30 June, I commenced an investigation into the death of Jan Klempar, age 30. The investigation has not yet concluded, and the inquest has not yet been heard. The cause od death is provisionally given following post-mortem as 1a) Drowning.
4	CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DEATH
	On the day in question, Mr Klempar was swimming in the sea at Porthcurno in west Cornwall a beach that, ordinarily, has lifeguard cover. I understand no lifeguards were on duty.
5	CORONER'S CONCERNS
	During the course of the investigation, my inquiries have revealed matters giving rise to concern. In my opinion there is a risk that future deaths will occur unless action is taken. In the circumstances it is my statutory duty to report to you.
	The MATTERS OF CONCERN are as follows.
	1) I have previously written drawing to your attention my concerns about a reduced level of lifeguard cover on Cornish beaches (Pender deceased.) I understand that from a position of no lifeguard cover (Whitsun Bank Holiday) there is now some service at a number of the main beaches. It is not clear to me whether the level of service will be further increased to 2019 levels or whether there will be a reduced service for the rest of the summer season? Is there a published plan available to the public that sets out where lifeguard cover will be provided and
