be committed for contempt to prison for a (total) period of 14 weeks

The order is suspended until 28 April 2022 and will not be put into force if during that time⁽²⁾

that he obey the terms of the interim injunction granted on 28 April 2020 including any variations of that injunction made by the Court, and the terms of any final injunction that may be granted at trial, including any variations of that injunction made by the Court.
