- 1. Failing to allow access to his property on reasonable notice on 4 occasions in breach of paragraph 1 of the injunction order.
- 2. Failing to put his property into a clean and tidy condition and to keep the property in such a condition and clear and free from obstruction in breach of paragraphs 2 and 3 of the injunction order.

## 5. and imposed the following sentence for that breach
