**The Marriage of YUSUF MAYET and SAMIA EL SAYED HASSAN AHMED OSMAN**

**IN THE MATTER of an application to commit the Respondent to Prison for alleged contempt of court**

### **THE PARTIES**

**The Applicant is Samia El-Sayed Ahmed Hassan Osman** who attended in person and was represented by Mr Mason of Counsel instructed by Mr Khan of Ashwells solicitors

**The Respondent is Yusuf Mayet** who attended in person and was represented by Mr Yearsley of Counsel instructed by Cartwright King solicitors

### **RECITALS**

- a. The Applicant gave evidence and was cross examined
- b. The Respondent exercised his right not to give evidence

### **FINDINGS**

- 1.The court found that on 17 occasions between 28<sup>th</sup> September 2021 and 27<sup>th</sup> May 2022 the Respondent had, in breach of an injunction , with a penal notice endorsed, made (as part of a Financial Remedy Order ) on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2021 sent emails to the Applicant relating to the proceedings or the implementation thereof
2. 15 other allegations of breach of the said order were found not to have been proved
3. In respect of each of the 17 breaches the Respondent Yusuf Mayet was committed to prison for a period of 3 weeks ; the first two sentences to run consecutively and the remaining 15 concurrently
4. The Respondent was ordered to pay £8,000 toward the Applicant's costs of the application for committal
